²³ Furthermore, the former priests were many in number, because they were prevented by death from continuing in office; ²⁴ but he holds his priesthood permanently, because he continues forever. ²⁵ Consequently he is able for all time to save those who approach God through him, since he always lives to make intercession for them.

²⁶ For it was fitting that we should have such a high priest, holy, blameless, undefiled, separated from sinners, and exalted above the heavens. ²⁷ Unlike the other high priests, he has no need to offer sacrifices day after day, first for his own sins, and then for those of the people; this he did once for all when he offered himself. ²⁸ For the law appoints as high priests those who are subject to weakness, but the word of the oath, which came later than the law, appoints a Son who has been made perfect forever.

Affirmation of Faith

is an excerpt from the Scots Confession. The Scots Confession was an act of Scottish Parliament in 1560 to unify standards of faith and confession in the church throughout Scotland. Led by church reformers-among them John Knox, the father of Presbyterianism -the document borrows from the Reformed theology of John Calvin to clarify traditional reformed emphases like the sovereignty of God, the importance of scripture, and the formation of a church distinguished from Roman Catholicism.

***AFFIRMATION OF FAITH**

We confess and acknowledge one God alone, to whom alone we must cleave, whom alone we must serve, whom only we must worship, and in whom alone we put our trust. Who is eternal, infinite, immeasurable, incomprehensible, omnipotent, invisible; one in substance and yet distinct in three persons, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost. By who we confess and believe all things in heaven and earth, visible and invisible, to have been created, to be retained in their being, and to be ruled and guided by his providence for such end as his eternal wisdom, goodness and justice have appointed, and to the manifestation of his glory.
